In destinations like Sonamarg and Pahalgam, you can enjoy the refreshing breeze by the riverbanks, where the wind feels cool against your skin while the sun provides a pleasant balance.

Autumn (September to November):

- With temperatures ranging from 10°C to 25°C, autumn brings a unique charm to Kashmir. The chinar leaves change from vibrant green to a beautiful brownish hue as they wither. Mornings and evenings can be quite cold, so layering up is recommended to stay comfortable while enjoying the stunning fall foliage.

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Winter (December to February)

- This is Kashmir's magical season, where everything transforms into a snowy wonderland. Temperatures can range from -15°C to 15°C, so triple-layered clothing is essential. Winter is peak season, so booking your stay ahead of time is advisable to ensure you get the best experience in the snow-covered paradise.
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Essential Travel Documents

Travel Options

By Air:

- **Flights to Srinagar:**

Booking Tips:

By Train:

- **To Jammu:**

Currently, the train from Jammu to Srinagar is under construction and is expected to open between late 2024 and early 2025. For now, you'll need to use alternative transportation.

By Road:

- **From Jammu:**

The drive from Jammu to Srinagar takes about 5 to 6 hours in a private cab. The road is smooth for most of the journey, but expect some construction near Ramband. You'll encounter 4 to 5 tolls along the way.

- **Private Cab or Taxi:**

For a comfortable and hassle-free journey, consider using **KashmireX**.

They offer reliable taxi services that ensure a smooth ride from Jammu to Srinagar.

Local Transportation

In Srinagar and Beyond:

- **Taxis and Cabs:** Local taxis and cabs are readily available for getting around Srinagar. They are a convenient option for visiting local attractions and exploring the city. (Recommended)
- **Auto-Rickshaws:** For shorter distances within the city, auto-rickshaws are a popular and affordable choice.(fast but expensive)
- **Public Buses:** Buses are available for traveling between cities and towns in Kashmir, but they might not be as comfortable as private options. Download the Chalo App to check the live location of buses.(Mostly Full Packed)
